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RIMI YANG

RIMI YANG'S PAINTINGS evoke dreams and stories, reminding us of images and figures we might know from fairytales, mythology and history. She blends the familiar together in an unfamiliar way as she juxtaposes her own experiences and memories with her knowledge of history and folklore. As a Korean-born artist who was raised in Japan but has lived in the U.S. since 1986, Yang has a varied background from which she weaves together her imagery and draws her inspiration.

Her work reveals an almost childlike playfulness and innocence, but it would be a mistake to think the artist is unaware or unsophisticated in her technique and practice. She admits that her paintings often start from an intense fascination, whether with a type of costume or a historical era. Yet these moments only serve as a beginning for her paintings, as moments quickly superseded by the process of painting itself. Once she starts a work, she prefers to let one brushstroke flow to the next without overanalyzing it.

Despite her attention to both iconic images and the material process of painting, Yang never forgets the viewer. And while her paintings feature both figures and abstract passages, space is equally important to her. She does not clutter her canvases with too many details, opting instead to leave herself and her viewers a space for their eyes and minds to rest, a space to breath. Though her works have developed from early abstract paintings to ones that usually set human or animal figures against a neutral or colorful background, abstract passages remain key elements within her work. As she describes in her own words while showing her generous concern for her audience: "It's important to me to leave space for viewers to access the scene and discover their own story—and the abstract passages allow that to happen."
